What is Title 1?

Title 1 is the largest federal aid program for public schools in the United States. ... Title 1 is a federal entitlement program that gives funds to schools in need based on student enrollment, the free and reduced lunch percentage for each school, and other informative data.

What is Title I is used for?

Parent's Right to Know

Parents have the right to know about the teaching qualifications of your child's classroom teacher in a school receiving Title I funds.

YOU HAVE THE RIGHT TO KNOW

- •Whether the teacher has met State qualification and licensing criteria levels and subject areas in which the teacher provides instruction;
- •Whether the teacher is teaching under emergency or other provisional status through which State qualification or licensing criteria have been waived;
- •Whether the teacher is teaching in the field of discipline of the certification of the teacher; and
- •Whether your child is provided services by paraprofessionals and, if so, their qualifications.





School-Parent Compact

A written agreement that outlines how the parents, the entire staff and the students will share the responsibility for improved student academic achievement, as well as describes how the school and parents will build and develop a partnership that will help children achieve the state's high standards.




Parent Advisory Council Representative

- The school's building leadership team work with the school's principal and the Parent Advisory Council representative in developing a Title I Parent Plan and parent-student compact for the school.


MIDDLESBORO MIDDLE SCHOOL ACHIEVEMENT DATA
